Fleet Science Center

The Fleet connects people of all ages to the possibilities and power of science for creating a better future. Explore more than 100 interactive exhibits and marvel at an IMAX film adventure showing the wonders of the planet and beyond.

San Diego History Center

Engaging, family-friendly exhibitions tell remarkable stories of our region – past, present and future. It offers public programs, special events and the region's largest collection of historical materials containing 45 million documents and 2.5 million images.

San Diego Junior Theatre

The nation's oldest youth theatre presents high-quality productions, including educational and community programs for children ages 3 – 18 with drama, dance, voice and theatre production classes.

San Diego Museum of Art

The region's oldest, largest and most visited art museum contains a nationally-renowned permanent collection, major exhibitions from around the world, extensive year-round programming and art history archives.

San Diego Museum of Man

San Diego's only anthropological museum showcases unique, interactive exhibits that cover a vast range of human history and culture.

San Diego Natural History Museum

California's second-oldest scientific institution houses the Biodiversity Research Center of California. It displays 7.4 million species while providing dynamic natural history experiences and environmental education through exhibits, publications and programs.

Timken Museum of Art

San Diego's "Jewel Box" of fine art is home to the Putnam Foundation, presenting a world-class collection of European and 19th century American masterpieces as well as Russian icons. It features the only Rembrandt painting on public display in San Diego, with free admission to all.









Bucks4Buses provides transportation and educational access for San Diego school children to experience the rich cultural landscape of Balboa Park. These special Grants are aimed at the underserved student population, particularly Title 1 schools. Imagine-many of these children have never been to Balboa Park.  are given to a portion
 of our 10 designated
 Beneficiary organizations
 in rotation, year after year.
